Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student should be able to

1. describe and apply central concepts in e-business strategies for different platforms in different sectors
2. give an account of and analyse macro environment and business structure when developing e-business strategies
3. give an account of and analyse the internal dimensions when developing an e-business
4. describe and apply "value process framework"
5. analyse scientific articles and argue for different underlying theoretical concepts for e-business strategies.

Course contents

- Analysis of different frameworks for e-strategies
- Strategy options in e-business markets
- Study of the possibilities in an e-business market
- To choose appropriate strategies for buyer and vendor in an e-market
- Application and evaluation of mobile trade
- Implementation of different e-business strategies
- Systematic ways to develop innovations with the aim to make the competition irrelevant
