Intended learning outcomes

Expected learning outcomes include for the participants to be able to independently:

- Use and interpret technical management-models as these are presented in the literature and in organizational practice
- Develop an awareness for and assess the history of ideas and theoretical basis of management in the technology-intensive company
- Explain the management issues of the technology-intensive organization and utilize management-techniques in this field
- Critically analyze and adapt management-models
- Develop their own techniques for managing organizations

Course contents

Lectures, seminars and workshops dealing with the goals of the course, based on readings of classical and modern theories of management. Lectures will deal with subjects such as the pre-understanding of management, conceptions of knowledge, and the usability of management models. Independent assignments where the participants critically analyze specific management cases and theories and work with the technologies of management.

Examination
