Intended learning outcomes

To broaden participant's perspective on experience-based knowledge by developing insights into the art of analogical thinking which is a salient feature of skill.

Course contents

Topics: Skill and different traditions of knowledge. Dialogue and tacit knowledge. Dialogue seminar method. Skill and quality. Leadership in complex organizations. Case studies. Analogical thinking.

Disposition

The course is given during the daytime. It is concentrated on a certain number of days. Students have to come to KTH or some other place 5 or 6 times. The course is not a distance one. It is given in Swedish. Lectures, seminars and individual writing assignments.
