Intended learning outcomes

On completion of the course, the student should be able to:

- describe the structure of the legal system
- describe the fundamental features of the legislation process
- explain the implication of basic legal concepts within the fields that are studied
- interpret legal text in the statute book
- solve simple legal problems by using the statute book
- identify and analyse and apply adequate civil laws to solve legal problems
- make an analysis of a legal case from a manufacturing company
